

mathematical problems to work on (as a team) and to present their solutions to the class.

Presentation: Each student will research a mathematical topic and give a short presentation. Topics will be chosen from a list provided by the instructor.

Academic Honesty: All assigned work must be done entirely by the student or students to whom the work has been assigned. Any violation of this will be considered as academic dishonesty and will result in a grade of F for the course. Likewise, anyone found being assisted, or assisting another, on the final exam will receive a grade of F for the course.

Classroom rules: It is important that every student be able to learn and work in an atmosphere conducive to learning. Interruptions, excessive noise, or other potentially distracting behavior should not take place during class time. The following are not allowed during class time: cell phones ringing, beeping, etc. (all cell phones must be off!); eating or drinking; classroom conversation not relevant to class discussion; sleeping; excessive tardiness; leaving class early without prior notice to the instructor; any other disruptive behavior. Violations of these rules will be handled as follows: (a) 1st or 2nd violation: warning (b) more than 2 violations: student will be withdrawn from class and receive a W (or WF if after the deadline for withdrawal without penalty).
