“Educating the UWG Community on Green Issues”

iServe Mentoring pairs upper-class peer mentors with first-year students to help ease their transition to college life academically and socially. Fall semester 2009, students in iServe enroll in a special section of American Government (Political Science 1101), a Core Curriculum course, examining the politics of global warming. Together, student and mentor complete a series of projects linked to the climate change theme while educating the campus and community about the global issue.

- Al Gore’s The Climate Project Presentation (October 20 at 7pm in Campus Center Ballroom)
 - To increase awareness of global climate change
- Campus Sustainability Week
 - To increase campus awareness of sustainability
- “Walk to Class” Days Campaign
 - Mentors will lead freshmen through a campaign to encourage students to walk to class one day of the week to address greenhouse gas emissions from transportation.
- Hands on Carroll County (October 2nd and 3rd)
 - Students will participate in an outdoor community service project as part of the annual Hands on Carroll County event.
- Letter to Representative about sustainability
 - Freshmen will write a letter to ask a local representative to take a stand on global warming
- Public Service Announcement Video
 - Mentor and protégé teams will collaborate to produce a public service announcement video informing faculty, staff, students and the community about climate change.
- Green Blog
 - Each student will initiate a discussion pertaining to global warming. The objective of this assignment is to engage students in conversations about the global issue.

Protégés will be engaged in 3-5 hours of project work each week.
