### REQUIREMENTS FOR A MINOR IN ANTHROPOLOGY

Students with majors in other disciplines may complete a Minor in Anthropology. The Anthropology Minor requires 18 hours of Anthropology courses distributed among the following: ANTH 1102 (*Introduction to Anthropology*); either ANTH 2001 (*Case Studies in Archaeology*) or 2002 (*Case Studies in Sociocultural Anthropology*) or 2003 (*Case Studies in Physical Anthropology*); and 12 hours at the 3000-4000 level.
