The School of Nursing is accepting applications for admission to the post-master's certificate in Nursing Education – Nurse Educator Role, which is starting **SUMMER SEMESTER 2010**. Classes begin **JUNE 7, 2010**. Advantages of this program are:

- ✓ Non-refundable \$30.00 application fee (one time only)
- ✓ One official transcript from each college or university attended
- ✓ Evidence of current licensure as a registered nurse (RN) in the United States and licensure in the state of practicum experience.
- ✓ Earned Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree from an NLNAC or CCNE accredited program
- ✓ Professional resume
- ✓ Three [letters of recommendation](#) from individuals knowledgeable of your professional and academic abilities (see below)
- ✓ Satisfactory [certificate of immunization](#) (New Students Only)
- ✓ [Academic Honor Form](#)

IMPORTANT: The School of Nursing offers two post-master's certificate programs in Nursing: 1) Nurse Education; and 2) Health Systems Leadership with a focus in Leader/Manager Role or Clinical Nurse Leader Role. Please indicate on your application form which track you are interested in pursuing.

The School of Nursing post-master's certificate program in Nursing Education prepares advanced practice registered nurses for careers in nursing education. Admission is limited to registered nurses licensed in Georgia with an earned master's degree in nursing from an NLNAC or CCNE accredited program. The certificate may be earned in a minimum of 3 semesters and is conducive for individuals working full time. Internet access is required as a majority of the content for this program will be offered online.
