

## GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN PUBLIC MANAGEMENT

Applicants interested in pursuing graduate training in Public Management should submit proof of the following to the Graduate School at least 20 days prior to the beginning of the semester in which you plan to enroll:

SUMMER SEMESTER 2009	CLASSES BEGIN MAY 18, 2009 (SESSION I), JUNE 8, 2009 (SESSION II & SESSION III), and JULY 6, 2009 (SESSION IV)
FALL SEMESTER 2009	CLASSES BEGIN AUGUST 13, 2009
SPRING SEMESTER 2010	CLASSES BEGIN JANUARY 6, 2010

**IMPORTANT:** Twelve (12) graduate semester hours are required to complete the Graduate Certificate Program in Public Management (please see page 2 for more information). Should a student decide to apply to the Masters in Public Administration program after successfully completing the certificate program, nine (9) graduate semester hours may be applied toward the MPA degree within six (6) years of completion and award of the certificate. However, students must apply and be accepted to the MPA program before completion of their ninth (9) graduate semester hour toward the certificate. Applicants admitted to the Graduate Certificate in Public Management program must complete their studies within four (4) years from the date of admission and receive no less than a 3.0 GPA.

Students deciding to apply for admission to the Masters in Public Administration program after completing the graduate certificate program must take the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and meet all other admission requirements for the MPA degree (please see [www.westga.edu/~gradsch/forms/printable/MAMS.pdf](http://www.westga.edu/~gradsch/forms/printable/MAMS.pdf) for more information).
