MISSION OF THE SCHOOL OF NURSING AT UWG:

The mission of the School of Nursing is to offer high quality undergraduate and graduate education that:

- Prepare registered nurses for basic and advanced practice roles in diverse health care settings in Georgia and the surrounding region.

DESCRIPTION OF THE MSN CURRICULUM

The School of Nursing at the University of West Georgia offers a Master of Science in Nursing degree with role options in either education or health systems leadership and a post masters certificate program in education and health systems leadership. The nursing education track is a program of study that addresses innovations in curriculum, instructional skills and strategies, the development and use of educational technology, and educational assessment and evaluation. Students will develop expertise in health education and promotion, patient education, professional development, or college/university teaching. The health systems leadership track is a program of study designed to prepare nurse managers/leaders and clinical nurse leaders (CNL's). The CNL is a new role designed by the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN, 2003) to prepare a leader who is accountable for management of care and the care environment. Courses focus on patient-centered care, evidence-based practice, pharmacology, case management client-care coordination, holistic health assessment, care of diverse populations, health policy, health systems, business and economics, statistics, leadership and management, quality improvement, risk management, and public/community health.

Courses in the curriculum build upon courses in the baccalaureate program in nursing. Students apply research concepts, theories, and skills in the development of the role components of the program. The Master of Science in Nursing Program is designed to meet the need for nurse educators, leaders/managers, and CNL's in a variety of health care settings. Students may complete the course of study in four semesters of full time course work (9 hours/semester), or students may pursue the degree on a part-time basis.

The MSN program is fully accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants seeking admission to the MSN program should be committed to engaging in caring nursing practices with individuals from diverse backgrounds. Nursing practice is holistic and recognizes the relationship of the mind, body, and spirit. As critical thinkers, students will be expected to examine personal value systems and the value systems of others. Students seeking admission to this program should consider their personal goals and values in light of those expressed in the philosophy of the program.

The School of Nursing accepts applications for admission once per year. Proof of the following should be submitted to the Graduate School Office by **MAY 23, 2011** to be considered for admission for **FALL SEMESTER 2011**.

- ✓ Non-refundable \$30.00 application fee (one time only)
- ✓ One official transcript from each college or university attended
- ✓ Earned Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree from an NLNAC or CCNE accredited program.
- ✓ 3.0 GPA (4.0 scale) for all upper division nursing courses
- ✓ Evidence of current licensure as a registered nurse (RN) in the United States and licensure in the state of practicum experience.
- ✓ An acceptable Graduate Record Examination ([GRE](#)) or Miller Analogies Test ([MAT](#)) test score. Please see page 3 for more information.
- ✓ Completion of a basic undergraduate statistics course with a grade of C or higher prior to enrollment or during the first semester of the program
- ✓ Professional resume
- ✓ Three [letters of recommendation](#) from individuals knowledgeable of your professional and academic abilities (over)
- ✓ Satisfactory [certificate of immunization](#) (if you are a new student)
- ✓ [Academic Honor Form](#)

Upon receipt of all application materials by the UWG Graduate School and determination by the School of Nursing that all admission criteria are met, including minimum GRE or MAT scores and grade point average, the Graduate School will notify selected applicants regarding admission status. A separate mailing will be sent by the School of Nursing providing additional information.

These criteria represent minimal standards and provide no guarantee of acceptance. Admission to the Master of Science in Nursing program is competitive and granted by the Graduate Committee of the School of Nursing and the Graduate School.

THE IMPORTANCE OF ADMISSION TEST SCORES

All students applying for admission to the Master of Science in Nursing program at the University of West Georgia must submit an official entrance examination score on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) or the New Millers Analogies Test (MAT). Regular admission requires a GRE score of at least 800 (a minimum of 400 on the verbal and 400 on the quantitative sections of the exam). A GRE Analytical Writing test score of at least 3.5 or higher is also required. Regular admission requires a New Miller Analogies Test (MAT) scaled score of 396-401 (percentile rank of 46-54). Test scores for the MAT will only be accepted if taken after October 1, 2004. Please see page 3 for more information.

PROVISIONAL ADMISSION

Applicants applying to a masters degree program in the arts and sciences or education with less than the required GPA and GRE scores may be considered for provisional admission. They must submit official GRE test scores and must also have a grade point average of at least 2.2. In no event may the grade point average be less than 2.2. Programs may have higher grade point average and/or test score requirements. Applicants may also be admitted provisionally for reasons other than, or in addition to, grade point average and GRE test scores. **Meeting departmental test score and grade point average requirements is no guarantee of admission. Provisional admission is ultimately subject to departmental approval and the Dean of the Graduate School.** These criteria do not apply to applicants to Education Specialists or doctoral programs.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Non-degree and personal enrichment students may be admitted to select nursing courses on a space available basis only. Please be aware that no more than 9 hours taken as a post baccalaureate or non-degree student may subsequently be applied to a degree. In most situations, students will not be allowed to take the full 9 hours; therefore, students attempting to gain admittance to a degree program should make every effort to take the appropriate admissions test as soon as possible.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

The three required letters of recommendation must be submitted by the application deadline to the Graduate School in a sealed envelope that is signed across the envelope's seal by the individual making the recommendation. A faculty member knowledgeable of your performance in your BSN program must write one of the letters.

Graduate School Policies with Regard to the Acceptance of Miller Analogies Test Scores

The Graduate School of the University of West Georgia will accept scores from the Miller Analogies Test (MAT) pursuant to the following policies (**PLEASE DO NOT CONFUSE THE MAT WITH THE GMAT. MAT SCORES ARE NOT ACCEPTED FOR ADMISSION INTO GRADUATE PROGRAMS IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AND PROFESSIONAL ACCOUNTING**):

- Scores from tests taken **prior to** June 1996 **EXCEPT** for out-of-state scores from the MAT taken from October 1990 - August 1991. Scores from tests taken between October 1990 and August 1991 are not acceptable for graduate admission at UWG.
- The Graduate School will accept scores from the MAT taken after October 2004.

Faculty of some departments have not yet decided whether they will accept scores from the new MAT for admission to their programs. However, the MAT is being accepted for admission into the following programs:
