

How to cite sources

When you cite a book or source for the first time, you should offer the full citation.

Example:

John Doe, *Full Title* (City of Publication: Publisher, date), page cited.

When citing a journal article like Robinson, you should do it like this:

John Doe, "Article full title," *Journal Title* volume # (year): page cited.

The next time you cite any source after already citing it, use a shortened citation:

Doe, *short title*, pg.

If citing a source again after just citing it, use *ibid*. If that *ibid* is the same page number, just write *ibid*. If it is a different page number, cite the page.
