

Psychology:

Bureau Labor Statistics:

- The employment amount of psychologists overall is expected to grow 22 percent from 2010 to 2020, faster than the average for all occupations.
- Employment of clinical, counseling, and school psychologists is expected to grow 22 percent faster than the average of all occupations. A greater demand for psychological services in schools, hospitals, mental health centers, and social services agencies will drive employment growth
- Demand for clinical and counseling psychologists will increase as people continue to turn to psychologists to help solve or manage their problems.
- Demand for psychologists in the health care industry is also expected to increase, because their work on teams with doctors, social workers, and other healthcare professionals provides patients with comprehensive, interdisciplinary treatments.
- Employment of industrial-organizational psychologists is expected to grow 35 percent, much faster than the average for all occupations.
- Most graduates with a bachelor's degree in psychology find work in other fields such as business administration, sales, or education.
- Graduates with a master's degree in psychology can work as industrial-organizational psychologists.
- Most clinical, counseling, and research psychologists need a doctoral degree.
- School psychologists need a master's, specialist, or doctoral degree.

- Substance Abuse and Behavioral Disorder Counselors are expected to grow 26.9% from 2008 to 2018.
