POSTMASTER'S CERTIFICATE
NURSING EDUCATION

The Postmaster's Certificate for Nurse Educator is designed for a registered nurse who has earned a master's degree in another nursing specialization. To be granted the postmaster's certificate, students must complete a minimum of 10 credit hours at University of West Georgia Tanner Health System School of Nursing including 240 practicum hours.

Postmaster's educators students must successfully complete graduate didactic and clinical requirements of the Master's Educators program. A GAP analysis of the applicant's transcript will be completed to determine if additional courses are required to meet the certificate program guidelines. These courses include but are not limited to N6103 Health Promotion and Advanced Health Assessment, N6106 Pathophysiology and Pharmacology I, and N6107 Pathophysiology and Pharmacology II.
