

UWG POLICY NUMBER: 9.8

UWG POLICY NAME: Alcohol on Campus

POLICY:

All persons must comply with federal, state, and local laws and the policies of University of West Georgia and the Board of Regents governing the use, possession, distribution, and dispensation of alcoholic beverages while on the University of West Georgia campus and at University of West Georgia events.

CONTEXT:

This policy applies to:


- All faculty, staff, students, Foundation agents, rental groups, and visitors attending, organizing, or supervising University of West Georgia events that plan to serve alcohol on campus.
- **Exception:** This policy *does not* apply to the lawful use of alcohol in campus residences.

Alcohol may be served at University of West Georgia on-campus events only with approval. Once approval has been received, the University of West Georgia organizer must comply with the procedures established pursuant to this policy.

Alcohol served at tailgate events is permitted without prior authorization for University of West Georgia sporting events and certain other campus events as announced by the Office of the President, but hosts and participants are otherwise expected to abide by the procedures *enacted pursuant to this policy*.


The Chief Business Officer is authorized to establish procedures for compliance with this Policy.
