History and Development

The University of West Georgia was established as an Agricultural and Mechanical School in 1906. The school became a junior college in 1933 and was named West Georgia College.

The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia authorized the College to confer the Bachelor of Science degree in 1957, which made it a four-year college. West Georgia College was officially named State University of West Georgia in1996 and University of West Georgia in 2005.

The 645 acre campus is located in Carroll County, Georgia.

Accreditation

The University of West Georgia is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award baccalaureate, master and doctorate degrees.

The most recent accreditation was awarded in December 2014. The university was first accredited in 1936. Additionally, some departments and programs are accredited through discipline specific accrediting agencies and governing bodies.

Degree Programs

The University System of Georgia offer students higher education options at 29 institutions throughout the state. providing a wide range of academic programming including certificates and associates, baccalaureates, masters, doctoral and professional degrees.

As of August 2016, the University of West Georgia offers a total of 87 programs of study:

- 43 degree programs at the bachelors level
- 24 degree programs at the masters level
- 5 degree programs at the specialist level
- 4 degree programs at the doctoral level
- 9 degree programs at the post-baccalaureate certificate level
- 2 degree programs at the post-master's certificate level
