History and Development

The University of West Georgia was established as an Agricultural and Mechanical School in 1906. The School became a junior college in 1933 and was named West Georgia College.

The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia authorized the College to confer the Bachelor of Science degree in 1957, which made it a four-year college. West Georgia College was officially named State University of West Georgia in 1996 and University of West Georgia in 2005.

The University is home to a 645-acre campus located in Carroll County, Georgia, a 14.64-acre Brock Property on Tyus Rd. in Carrollton, Georgia, and a 5.55-acre instructional site in Newnan, Georgia.

Accreditation

The University of West Georgia is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award baccalaureate, master, educational specialist, and doctoral degrees.

The Institution was initially accredited in 1936, and was last reviewed and reaffirmed in 2014. The reaffirmation review covered the main campus and all extended sites. The institution's accreditation extends to all programs offered on the institution's main campus as well as those offered at all extended program sites wherever located. The institution is scheduled to receive its next affirmation of accreditation review in 2024.

Degree Programs

The University system of Georgia offers students higher education options at 26 institutions throughout the state, providing a wide range of academic programming including certificates and associate's, baccalaureates, master's, doctoral and professional degrees.

As of Fall 2019, the University of West Georgia offers a total of **87** programs of study:

- 45 degree programs at the baccalaureate level
- 23 degree programs at the master level
- 6 degree programs at the specialist level
- 5 degree programs at the doctoral level
- 6 degree programs at the post-baccalaureate certificate level
- 2 degree programs at the post-master's certificate level




