- I. *Call to Order and Opening Remarks to the Faculty:*** The meeting was convened in the Townsend Center for the Performing Arts. President (Dr.) Beheruz Sethna called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

President Sethna thanked those in attendance “for all the work you do.” He noted that UWG had the highest enrollment ever for the fall and the spring semesters and that UWG had received national recognition of both faculty and student work. “You get the credit and my and the institution’s thanks.”

Dr. Sethna after “having listened to faculty” input, then spoke to budget items for fall 2008. There will be an addition of 20 new faculty toward the Core curriculum and an additional 8 in the non-Core curriculum. Other budget items include faculty promotion and salary compression, increasing staff support, monies targeted toward initiatives for faculty research and for the Ombuds initiative. There will be a small increase put into travel budgets, library collection increases, and for leadership training.

President Sethna concluded his remarks addressing faculty accomplishments.
