<p><u>VICE PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS & ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT</u> Campus Center 678-839-6423</p>	Provides University leadership for out-of-class life and enrollment management efforts. Chairs Crisis Intervention Team, which responds to concerns about distressed and disruptive students. Advocates for students rights and concerns. Includes Assistant Dean of Students, who adjudicates alleged violations of the <i>Student Conduct Code</i> .
<p><u>ADMISSIONS</u> Mandeville Hall 678-839-4000</p>	Coordinates all undergraduate admissions efforts: Contacts with new students, campus tours, and visitation days, applications for admission for freshman and transfer students, visits to high schools to promote UWG.
<p><u>ADVISING CENTER</u> University Community Center/678-839-5342</p>	Offers academic coaching and supplemental instruction through workshops and programs.
<p><u>CAREER SERVICES</u> Row Hall, Third Floor, West Wing 678-839-6431</p>	Employment assistance for students seeking career, full-time, part-time, seasonal and summer jobs; on campus interviews and other career events to connect students with employers; co-op and internship experiences.
<p><u>CENTER FOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS</u> University Community Center 678-839-6280</p>	Academic advisement for all undeclared students, free tutoring, peer mentoring, major/career exploration, academic support services and college success skills training Refers students to other University offices when needed.
<p><u>CENTER FOR ADULT LEARNERS & VETERANS</u> University Community Center 312 678-839-5210</p>	Supports the retention, progression, and graduation of students at the University of West Georgia through services and programs for adult learners, veterans, and their families. The Center serves individual students and leads campus-wide education and awareness initiatives.
<p><u>CENTER FOR DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION</u> Row Hall, Second Floor, East Wing 678-839-5400</p>	Through a variety of programs, initiatives and collaborations, to work to reinforce and increase the campus' appreciation of, and sensitivity to issues related to diversity. Coordinates the Multicultural Achievement Program (MAP), which includes a peer mentoring program and other support services to help minority students succeed.
<p><u>CENTER FOR STUDENT INVOLVEMENT</u> Campus Center, 678-839-6526</p>	Co-curricular activities to complement and accentuate the formal learning process; student organizations and leadership training. Student Government Association advisement.
<p><u>COUNSELING CENTER</u> Row Hall, First Floor/678-839-6428</p>	Personal counseling & psychotherapy with licensed counselors, study skills, career counseling, crisis intervention, assistance for students with disabilities.
<p><u>ENROLLMENT SERVICE CENTER</u> Parker Hall, First Floor 678-839-6421</p>	A student's "first stop" for Registration and Financial Aid services, including assistance with readmission, registration, withdrawals, drop-add, transcript requests, <i>Wolf Watch</i> degree audit, financial aid applications and related documents, HOPE scholarships, and student loans.
<p><u>FINANCIAL AID</u> Parker Hall, Third Floor/678-839-6421</p>	Administers all financial aid. Assures compliance with relevant USG and Federal loans.
<p><u>FIRST-YEAR EXPERIENCE</u> Strozier Hall, Second Floor/678-839-4739</p>	Coordinates and supports UWG 1101 (Freshman Seminar) and Learning Communities. Manages Orientation Programs for new students and parents, and Commuter Student Services.
<p><u>GRADUATE & INTERNATIONAL ADMISSIONS</u> AYCOCK HALL, FIRST FLOOR/678-839-1394</p>	Admissions operational support for all graduate and International student applications.
<p><u>HEALTH SERVICES</u> Health Center - Infirmary 678-839-6452</p>	Medical assistance for students for all common ailments, pharmacy, limited lab services, gynecological services, emergency medical attention, sexual assault & crisis response, health education, and advocacy for students in crisis.
<p><u>HOUSING & RESIDENCE LIFE</u> East Commons, First Floor/678-839-6426</p>	On-campus housing for 3,000 students, including academic and social programs, and professional and paraprofessional live-in staff.
<p><u>REGISTRAR</u> Parker Hall, Second Floor 678-839-6438</p>	The "behind the scenes" work of registration. Manages the registration system and maintains permanent academic records. Handles graduation and transfer issues. Assures compliance with relevant USG and Federal requirements.
<p><u>UNIVERSITY RECREATION</u> Campus Center 678-839-5500</p>	Manages the Campus Center ballroom, meeting rooms, state-of-the art fitness facility, climbing wall, and game room (fitness facilities free for students, memberships available for faculty, staff, and retirees). Provides recreational opportunities, including intramural sports fitness activities, and adventure trips.
