3. Discussion of Governor Kemp's proposed Amended FY24 and FY25 budget

- USG amendment for FY24, to cover \$1k one-time supplement. This is already approved and done!
- USG budget for FY25, proposed \$66M back
- Cost-of-living adjustment, 4% for FY25 (see pg. 8), capped to \$3,000 per person, would be permanent salary adjustment

Next steps for the state budget. We are in phase 4, awaiting legislative review and changes. <u>The Budget Process | Governor's Office of Planning and Budget (georgia.gov)</u>

Then after budget is approved, USG has step to distribute funds. Anticipating April or May. This would be for UWG's budget. If COLA is approved by legislature and signed by governor, this would just flow through.

Then UWG makes allocations after fixed costs, which includes salaries. Will start working on FY25 (and further) in budget development.

4. New business

Study abroad compensation for faculty.

- A major consideration is the need (unaddressed through policy) for two faculty to go. Also concern about having both a male and female faculty member.
- Pamela, Laura, Paul, and Minna to serve as a Working Group formally dubbed "Faculty Senate Budget Committee Study Abroad Compensation Working Group" with the charge of creating a document with recommendations about faculty compensation for teaching study abroad programs
- There are USG policies
- Dr. Anne Gaqure-Parker administers the budget, including faculty salaries
- Fair compensation to faculty for summer study abroad, especially considering the level of work to prepare. These valuable programs take a lot of time to develop.
- If the cost of the study abroad program doesn't cover itself, where is the funding coming from? Looking for self-sufficiency. Can only keep a small amount in reserves for emergencies. What students pay should cover the cost of the program.
- Perhaps propose a per-program, a tiered payment structure (based on new program development or ones that are less expensive since they've been run before), or an equation of students to faculty to ensure costs are covered and faculty fairly compensated
- Suggestion to reach out to Dr. Chad Davidson for perspective on study abroad
