Minutes Approved.

- 3. Updates from the chair:
 - a. Senate meeting on April 14, 2023
 - i. Reserve Fund
 - 1. Bond R&R Reserves
 - a. Owned by each LLC, owned by the foundations and can be used only for major capital scale projects and certain facilities
 - 2. University Reserve Account
 - a. Unrestricted reserve funds vs. Foundation reserve funds
 - i. 2-5% of unrestricted funds in the state budget for reserves.
 - ii. Small percent of tuition funds to roll over .
 - iii. Most of our budget is from the restricted funds.
 - 3. Tuition amount of 3% max
 - a. Max to spend would be about 1.6 million, but there are exceptions and context to this.
 - i. Must account for a buffer
 - When in a declining tuition environment, we can't carry forward 1.4 million again because of the lower tuition revenues.
 - 4. Reminder that state allocation comes with 2-year lag.

- b. Study abroad Salaries for Summer Classes.
 - i. Announced by Provost at the Senate Meeting
 - 1. Based on budget, there was a \$40,000 gap this year
 - That the study abroad summer salaries will be fully funded this year.
- c. Graduate enrollment.
 - i. Update provided by Minna (from Dr. Varga)

1. Summer 2023

- a. 18% from approximately this time last year for Summer 1469 vs 1245
- b. We have admitted 5% (29% last week) more students than around this time last year 888 vs 759
- c. Our incomplete applications are up 27% (last week 17%) 363 vs 288
- d. We are up 32% in newly enrolled students and are 9% away from summer 22 census.
- e. Fall 2023 Summer Deadline April 15
- f. We are 25% above in applications from this time last year for Fall 784 vs 625
- g. We have admitted 36% more students than this time last year
- d. Undergraduate enrollment and retention update
 - i. Looking to ensure that enrollment knows they have representation on the committee
 - ii. Examining processes to ensure we have up-to-date information from all units
- e. Raises and budget.
 - i. Academic Affairs- about 1 million in cuts on operational, supplies, travel, and part-time. This is separate from the additional cuts from the state.
