
AMENITIES

All units within UWG housing provide individual Ethernet lines, wireless connections and cable TV. Each residential unit has access to a refrigerator and microwave. Laundry facilities are available in all buildings, and are free to use for all on-campus residents. Each student room assignment is supplied with one twin XL bed, desk, dresser and wardrobe or closet. Find a full list of amenities here.

EAST CAMPUS



Bowdon Hall, a first-year residence hall, is a co-ed traditional-style hall that has been fully renovated. Amenities include a movie theater, music studios, private study areas, and full-size kitchen.



<u>The Oaks</u>, a first-year residence hall, is a state-of-the-art suites-style residence hall that includes a meeting/presentation room, private study areas, TV rooms, and a full-size kitchen. This beautiful facility also has outdoor patios with comfortable seating areas for residents to enjoy.

CENTRAL CAMPUS



<u>Center Pointe Suites</u>, a first-year residence hall, has been a sought-after destination for living on campus. Amenities in this suites-style residence hall include a state-of-the-art meeting/presentation room, private study areas, TV rooms, a full-size kitchen and a patio with gas grill for resident use.



<u>University Suites</u>, is a 3-building hall for both first-year and upperclassmen students. University Suites 1 is reserved for first-years only, while University Suites 2 and 3 are reserved for upperclassmen. Amenities include an outdoor sand volleyball court, movie room, pool tables, study rooms and a full-size kitchen. Double and single suites are available for all students.

WEST CAMPUS



<u>Arbor View Apartments</u>, a residence hall for upperclassmen, features the amenities of apartment-style living on campus. Residents of Arbor View can enjoy exercising on the outdoor track or opt for the indoor gym. Amenities include game rooms, study areas and TV rooms.

<u>The Village</u> opened in Fall 2009 and can accommodate up to 18 registered student organizations. This community enhances student life at UWG by attracting potential members of any student organization by providing a residential site for the organization to flourish and expand.

LIVING-LEARNING COMMUNITIES

Living Learning Communities (LLCs) are specialized learning environments that connect students with experiences both inside and outside the classroom. Each LLC is unique, but all are centered on a distinctive theme or academic interest area. Students who choose to live in an LLC have a direct connection to their classroom experience, access to intentional events and programs, and dedicated staff members who work to make the community a success.

As a member of an LLC you will:

- Get to know your instructors in classes specific for your LLC
- Develop strong connections with your fellow neighbors, who are also your classmates
- · Have access to special resources, programs and activities

While completing your housing application, you will be asked to submit a short essay (around 250 words) about what you hope to gain from living in the LLC of your choice and what you plan to contribute to that LLC. Acceptance into an LLC directly impacts your housing assignment. Roommate requests can be honored only if your requested roommate has been accepted into the same LLC. The 2021-2022 LLC options are: Honors College, Music, uwGaming & Esports, and Ways of the Wolf (WOW).
