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RESEARCH AND TEACHING INTERESTS

Moral Injury has been my focus for the last few years. As I complete my manuscript, *Moral Injury and the American veteran* (2024 anticipated publishing), it highlights my research interest as a derivative from my dissertation, *The Experiential Effects of Combat Zone Deployment, on Veterans During the Reintegration Process*. Working with veterans and other marginalized populations grants me the opportunity to approach my research through phenomenology and narrative (the stories of our lives) methods and to illuminate the need for social justice culturally. Additionally, the concepts of Mattering and Soul Care (spirituality) are foundational to my personal philosophy of life as it is strongly connected to our identity and *who we are in the world* and *how do we find our place*. These ideologies also fuel my teaching and my desire to impact students through my scholarship. Central to my work is the role trauma plays in our lives daily, thereby giving students a humanistic purview of their world and how they too can identify their place in the world. Helping students navigate the complexities of life and theoretical learning along with praxis is at the core of why I teach.

Just Listening, Carrollton. GA

UWG's College of Social Sciences has partnered with Veterans Heart Georgia, an Atlanta-based non-profit organization, for a veteran-focused "Just Listening" circle in Carrollton Georgia. The community-based initiative brings local veterans and community members together to "just listen" to veterans share their stories as a way to better understand the experience of veterans processing through the reintegration process. Due to COVID-19, our time meetings are suspended. We are planning on returning when it is safe to do so.

Veterans in the Classroom

As a continuation for my dissertation, I partnered with Douglas County School System and brought 7 veterans to the classroom to teach students about their military experience. Students learned about the Vietnam War as well as life on an aircraft carrier and living in other countries and they were given the opportunity to ask questions to the speaker.

Cobb County Veterans Accountability Court System

Cobb County Veterans Court is a minimum 18-month long program focusing on rehabilitating veterans by diverting them from the traditional criminal justice system and providing them with the tools they need to lead a productive, law-abiding lifestyle. Research suggests many veterans suffer from adjustment issues when they come back into civilian life, such as post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injuries.

Coping with Loss

Loss is a difficult and tender time in a person's life. Coping with Loss is a journaling and group therapeutic process, to help those experiencing pain and grief learn a few tools to guide their process.

Learning to Love (L2L)



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I developed a pre-marital workshop for couples engaged and getting ready to take the next step of getting married. This study is a 5-part series teaching covering topics such as Foundation of Marriage, Conflict Resolution and External Relationships.

Missions to the Amazon
