Competencies and Interests

In 2003, I started an elective class at Newnan High School called the Vietnam War, which was based on the Lessons of Vietnam class taught by Lindy Poling in North Carolina. Through that class, I brought numerous veterans and participants into the classroom to interact with students and allow them to see the conflict through the eyes of the people involved. I also started a program celebrating its 30th anniversary in May 2025. It is called Student-Vet Connect today. On that day, at the end of each semester, Newnan High hosts 50-75 local veterans who set up tables with memorabilia of their service and talk to our students about their involvement in the military. This connection between what students have been learning in class and the people involved in those events impacts students in a way that cannot be matched in a regular classroom.
