Dissertation

Title: Rhetorics of Recovery: Writing about Addiction in the Public Sphere. I trace the history and literature of recovery groups and individual addicts over two centuries, analyzing addicts' own rhetorical methods, then compare this rhetoric with that of public-facing medical and technical writing on addiction. Using a case study of virtual substance abuse treatment software ads, I argue that presently, public-facing writing on addiction is harmfully misaligned with addicts' own rhetoric of recovery. Using this evidence, I propose a framework for writing on addiction which is justice-driven and centers the needs of addicts and alcoholics.
